<sup>1</sup> All diseases listed in this certificate are notifiable in Sweden and all, except Bluetongue, Enzootic bovine leucosis (EBL) and Bovine viral diarrhoea (BVD), are included in the Swedish Epizootic diseases act (SFS 1999:657). Any outbreaks of diseases included in the Swedish Epizootic diseases act will be managed and eradicated according to the Act. Both suspicions and any confirmed cases of EBL and BVD would be investigated and eradicated based on SFS 2006:806. In addition, measures would be taken in accordance with EU legislation as well as the WOAHP (World Organization for Animal Health) Terrestrial Animal Health Code. <sup>2</sup> Antibodies against European Bat Lyssavirus have been detected in Sweden. According to Article 8.14.2 of the WOAHP (World Organization for Animal Health) Terrestrial Animal Health Code, the rabies free status of a country is not affected by the isolation of antibodies against Bat Lyssavirus

Classical swine fever (CSF) Official freedom recognised by WOAHA	1944

<sup>3</sup> The classical type of BSE has never been recorded in Sweden. Only one single case of atypical BSE of age-type not related to the classical BSE was detected in 2006.
